Dear Sir,

I wish to add my support to the attached letter sent to you earlier today. In addition to the attached submission, EASA does not require certification for non air transport operations called Special Operations, including the following activities;

- agriculture
- construction
- photography
- surveying
- observation and patrol
- aerial advertisement

Removing the Part 119 certification requirement for these activities in NZ would allow CAA to concentrate on the activities where the public is most at risk in Air Transport Operations. While only agricultural activities currently have a certification requirement, there are some in CAA who believe some of the other activities above fall within a Part 135 requirements.
