## Request for advisers—Land Transport (Clean Vehicles) Amendment Bill

The Land Transport (Clean Vehicles) Amendment Bill was referred to the Transport and Infrastructure Committee by the House on 21 September 2021 with a report-back date of 2 February 2022.

At its meeting on 23 September 2021 the committee unanimously agreed to write to you as the Minister, seeking the provision of officials from the Ministry of Transport to serve as the committee's lead advisers on the bill. It also seeks the appointment of advisers from Waka Kotahi. The Committee agreed that MoT could work with Waka Kotahi and Inland Revenue as these agencies would administer the clean cars scheme and be involved in any GST and fringe benefit tax implications of the policies respectively.
