Purpose of the review

A modern and responsive air navigation system is critical to keeping New Zealand safe, connected, growing, resilient, and secure.

Te Manatū Waka Ministry of Transport is working with the aviation sector to undertake a broad, first principles review that looks at the air navigation system now and into the future.

By the end of 2021, we will establish the scope and terms of reference. We will start work on the review in early 2022.

Three key settings

The review will focus on settings in three key areas that influence the air navigation system:



Scope of the review

The core components of the air navigation system

The providers of those components

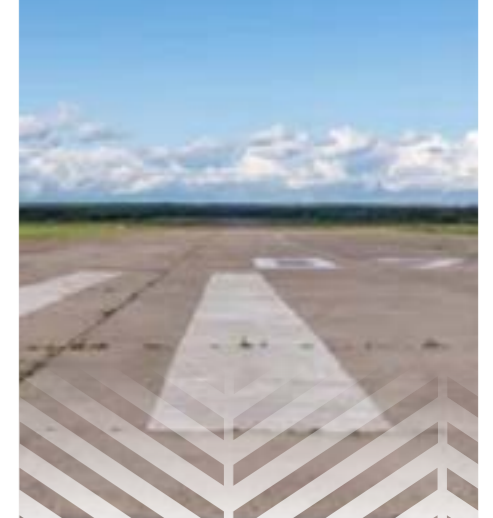
The users of the air navigation system. Who does it exist for?

The authorising environment

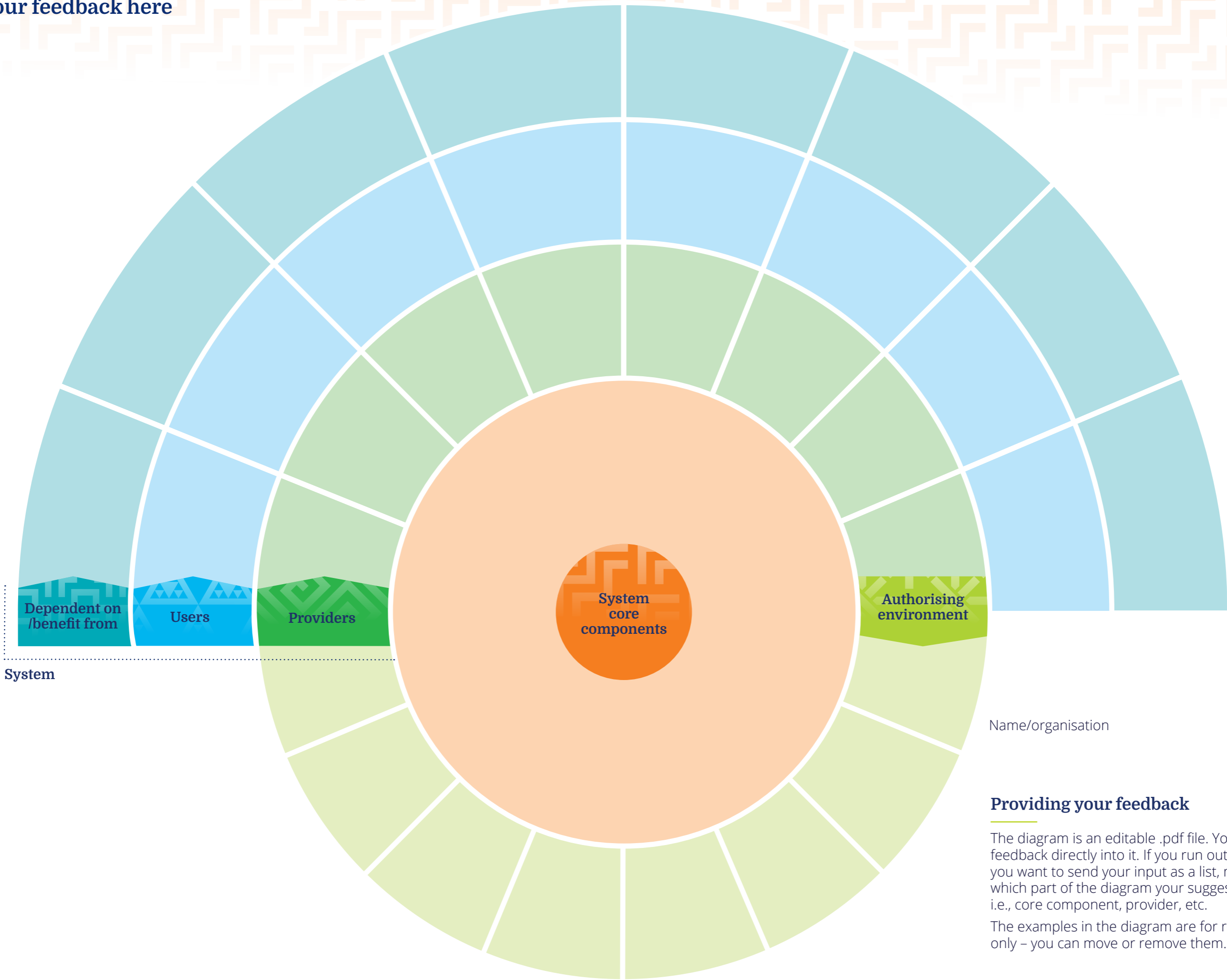
Once we've considered all feedback, we will develop a diagram that shows the scope of the review, as part of the terms of reference.
